How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

Our vision is to be Christ in Dumas, Texas, and we would like you to join us. Our mission to the community includes our active and energetic youth program and: -Supporting charitable organizations in our community such as Dumas Meals on Wheels, Dumas Discovery Center, Care Net of Dumas, Moore County Hospice, Safe Place, CASA 69, Amarillo Children's Home, NOROC, and The Refuge -Providing building space for Boy Scouts, Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, and a line-dancing group -Collecting food on Communion Sunday every month for the food pantry at the Catholic Church, stocking our onsite Blessing Box, monitoring the Story Bridge Little Library. We are Christ in our community through our: -Trunk or Treat Events, -BFF youth program, -First Friends Friday (a once-amonth lunch for students and faculty of Dumas ISD), -Ladies on the Lawn, -Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve services, and Vacation Bible School. During the pandemic, we staged our first "Drive-By Christmas" in the parking lot to offer an alternative celebration to members and visitors during the pandemic. We would like you to join us in our mission.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

We would like to embrace the diversity of our school district and surrounding community that includes 17 different languages and a diverse population of people. Our church wants to reach out to the unchurched to offer relevant experiences and relationships to include them in our faith journey. Dumas and the surrounding area support agricultural and petroleum industries including a beef packing plant, cheese factories and dairies which employ hundreds of potential members. Our local school district is currently building three elementary schools to meet the needs of the students in our growing community. We have recently renovated our local hospital and have brought in doctors to accommodate Dumas and the surrounding cities. FPC houses a Blessing Box to provide small food items and snacks to passersby as well as a Story Bridge library for neighboring youth to come and take books that are gently used. Our Good Samaritan Fund allows us to help families and individuals in need with monetary donations for food, utilities, and/or rent.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

We are a caring and loving congregation sharing that love and care with our community. We are open to a minister fresh out of seminary eager to try new and creative ideas or a second-career pastor ready to bring a suite of experience to the table -- and any level in between. We would like an individual to help us embrace the diversity of our community and offer relevant experiences and relationships to current and future members.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

We hope to find a pastor who will be Christ in Dumas and will join with members and staff by: -Continuing our church's participation in Palo Duro Presbytery -Contributing to community events such -- community Thanksgiving service, See You At the Pole, and Community Youth Tailgate Party Joining the Rotary Club or Lions Club -Creating content for our social media presence -Creating worship services that engage current members and invite new members -Inspiring us to find new ways to become a larger presence in the community -Joining in with youth activities at the church -Supporting members on mission trips to Belize Our youth program, Bible, Friends, & Fellowship, is a key part of our vision and outreach. BFF's Wednesday evening program includes children and youth from the church and community. Our youth director is creative, energetic, and enthusiastic, and she: -Helped us to serve the youth and adults of our church by creating "drop-off" communion kits for members and BFF activity bags and virtual lessons for youth in the spring of 2020 during Covid -Plans and coordinates lessons and adults for the BFF program, as well as our new Summer Nights VBS -Leads the youth in the following activities: -Mission trips -Fun in the Son -Souper Bowl of Caring -Youth Sunday Services -Flamingo Flocking -Youth luncheons

We would welcome a pastor who embraces our traditions such as: -Kirkin' of the Tartans where we have a bagpiper help to lead the congregation in dedication of the tartans -Our Advent Season of lighting of the Advent Wreath -Holy Week services with other local churches -Special Palm Sunday service with palms (and an occasional donkey); and We would also welcome a pastor who inspires us to create new and imaginative traditions to mesh with the old. Help us to be Christ in Dumas, Texas.
